

Safety report by "BMW George" Homenko - Safety Officer

Buying & Storing Motorcycle Tires

OK I'm cheap! With that said, it is very hard for me to pass up a deal.

Last summer, Cycle Gear had a very good price on a pair of highly rated Bridgestone tires. I had just purchased tires for my K1200s not a week before these became available. So, I bought them, although I would not need them for a while (please see the second sentence in this paragraph).

Now, I need to mount them on my bike. That started me wondering about how long you can keep motorcycle tires before you should mount them. I have heard a lot on this subject, but I wanted to get my information from a reputable source. So, I did what everyone does, I Googled the subject. I stayed away from blog posts and discussion boards. I can get those opinions from my biker friends over a cup of coffee. Here is what I found.

Continental Tire has a massive web page and if you dig down far enough I came to this site:

If you go to the site, scroll down until you see "Aging of unused tires" and click on that section.

Here is part of what you will find:

"Stored as recommended (e.g. in a cool, dry place not exposed to direct sunlight, chemicals, or other ozone effects), the tire will retain its balanced product profile for a long time."

"Up to five years after its production date, a correctly stored, unused Continental tire can be sold and used unconditionally like a new tire. However, Continental advises against selling or using used tires with an unknown history."





OK you can store tires up to 5 years from the production date if stored properly. Fortunately for me my wife has a wine cellar and it is a cool, dry and dark space. And it had room for 2 tires.

That does bring up one other question and that is how do you know when your tires were produced? This is also addressed at the Continental site:

"The production date stamp of any tire can be found on the sidewall after the "DOT" logotype stamped there. (Note: the date stamp is only located on one side of the tire)."

"In the case of tires we produced after 1999, the last four figures indicate the production date, with the first two representing the production week (and thus ranging from "01" to "53") and the last two the production year (e.g.: a tire with the marking "DOT XXXXXX2715" was manufactured in the 27th week of 2015)."

Now I would like to put a plug in for a local Santa Rosa company, The Motorcycle Shop located at 3383 Airway Dr. They will mount and balance a tire that was not purchased at their store for \$25 plus a disposal fee of \$4.50 and the cost of any weights used, if you bring the wheel in off the bike. For those of you that find that removing the rim is more than you want to do, I would call them and get a quote for changing a tire on the bike. Amounts can change depending on your ride because varying degrees of difficulty of removing the rim. I have found them to be fair and fast.



Know when to fold 'em,


Know when to walk away....

It occurred to me this sage advice applies to riding. How's that you may ask?

When there is not ice on the road, or snow, or loose gravel if we are on a big bike, when the winds are not blowing a gale. When your riding companions are sober and sane.

When should we fold em? Or not ride? When the weather threatens snow, or hail, or heavy rain. You just can't cheat your way out of the laws of physics which apply to two wheels on ice or snow or puddles.





When the route is too demanding, twisty, composed of poor surface conditions.

When your companions are drunk or stoned. When you are not dressed right for the conditions...hypothermia will drop your skills and reaction time severely. Hyperthermia will muddle your brain and judgement also knocking your riding skills for a loop.

When your companions are riding faster than your skills or comfort level allow. Are we immune to peer pressure to ride a certain way now that we have attained a "mature age"? I really doubt it. We'll still want to keep up with young bucks riding recklessly if we are in their pack. This temptation is a bad idea which can easily result in a high-speed crash.

Most of us have been riding long enough to have seen bad things happen on bikes when you do not "hold em" and ride into danger with poor judgement. In a matter of seconds your life can change tragically for the worse. It is no fun to admit this, but it cannot be denied.

Now if you will humor me, I will return to the lyrics of Kenny Rogers, with just a minor edit.

"Now ev'ry rider knows that the secret to survivin'

Is knowin' what to throw away and knowing what to keep.

'Cause ev'ry hand's a winner and ev'ry hand's a loser,

And the best that you can hope for is to die in your sleep."

Ta Ta for now, Redwood Riders.....Rubber side down.








Stinson Beach Ride


