## Safety Report

Slip Slidin' Away...

Paul Simon put to song the issue of "slip sliding away". Remember the tune? "The nearer your destination the more you keep slip sliding away".

Well like the guy in that tune, we sometime are at risk for "slip sliding away". What?

When we come to a stop and place one foot on the surface, that foot has been known to slip or slide away.

What are those risk factors that make this possible?

The most obvious is gravel on the road. Putting one foot down on gravel and leaning on it can produce an unhappy surprise.


If you ride a lot, you've encountered gravel from trucks that has spilled over onto the road where you might need to stop. Keep a sharp eye out for these slip risks and put your foot down squarely and when the bike is nearly stopped.

Of course, gravel road surfaces, whether decorative pea gravel or just drain rock can also cause your bike to fall over if you plant your foot abruptly without taking the unstable surface into account.

What other things can cause unexpected slips? Some are commonly overlooked. Thick paint on the road marking turn lanes have a much slicker consistency than asphalt or cement. If you happen to stop on a thick yellow paint job marking a turn lane, be extra careful when planting your feet, especially the first foot you put down. That thick yellow paint can be very slippery.

Manhole covers are made of steel and are much more slippery than asphalt. Be careful if you happen to stop on one.

Similar slips can be caused by wet leaves, pine needles or other debris found in nature that have been known to blow onto the roadway.



Some vehicles leak oil. Always stay alert for oil, even if it appears dry, that can appear randomly under our bikes. Try really hard not to stop in a place that requires you to put your foot onto an oil slick. Oil slicks are particularly dangerous when it has rained after a long dry spell. They often appear near gas pumps. If you cannot avoid an oil patch, or another of these slippery dangers, try to bring your bike almost to a full stop before planting your feet, and put both feet on the surface as soon as possible.



No one wants to drop their bike due a slippery, unnoticed slick spot. Be "heads up" and keep a sharp eye for these dangers so they do not give you an unhappy and embarrassing surprise.

## Tom's Take

### "The Nightmare at Left Turn"


## Freddy Krueger is no more scary or dangerous than what we often face while riding.

A recurring nightmare for motorcycle riders is the car or truck, seemingly sightless, which turns left into our path against our right of way. We know all too well that "right of way" means nothing when a bike collides with a car driven by an oblivious person. Such accidents are among the most common and most serious things we must guard against... but how?

Stay extra alert at intersections, most especially when a car seems to be preparing to turn left in front of you, or as you approach. If a rider is totally alert to the possibility of an illegal, dangerous left turn, the risk of being hit or hitting the car can be reduced.

So what signs should we look for to alert us? For a start, where are the driver's eyes looking? Are they focused on you, or do they seem not to notice your presence? Sound your horn, or slow, even to a stop if necessary if the driver in the left turn lane does not seem to see you.

Is there a gap in the traffic going your way? Cars going in your direction in front and behind you are a much more visible presence than a solo rider. If you are solo, be even more alert to the possibility of car turning left in front of you.





Is the driver eating, drinking or talking on the phone (illegal of course)? If yes, avoid the car like the plague. Put distance, however you can between your bike and that car. There is a good chance you will not be "seen" by such a dangerous motorist.

Where are the car's wheels pointed? If they are already turned to the left the likelihood of an abrupt left turn is increased. Prepare for evasive action if you see a car whose wheels are turned to the left early or before the turn is initiated. Quickly change lanes to avoid the possible left turning car. Or slow way down to give yourself time to see what the left turning car may be getting ready to do.

Nothing we can do while riding can insure us against thoughtless, inattentive drivers. But following the suggestions here may shift the odds a bit more in our direction.

## Officer Elections

# 2019 ELECTIONS NOVEMBER 20, 2018

The RRMC Board of Directors Election will be held during the November General Meeting. If you want to participate

more with the operating and direction of the club, becoming a Board Member is an ideal opportunity.

While all positions are open, the Membership Director and Treasurer positions are vacant as Dee Dee will be stepping down. If you are interested in ANY position or want more information regarding the position's responsibilities and duties, please contact the current office holder to let them know you are interested.

Below are descriptions of the Board Positions which are condensed versions contained with the club's By-Laws.

**President:** The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board of Directors. The President has general supervision of the operation of the club. A President's Book shall be created and once created it shall be maintained and updated by the President. The President's Book shall be passed on to each succeeding President. The Book shall outline the duties and responsibilities of the Office, that of the Board of Directors positions and contain any pertinent information regarding the operation of the club.

Vice President: The Vice President shall take over duties of the President in his/her absence.

**Membership Director:** The Membership Director shall be responsible for receiving, processing and recording membership applications and membership fees. The Membership Director will promote the club to non-members whenever possible and appropriate. The Membership Director should be well informed as to club policies, functions and all matters pertaining to the club with a goal of increased membership. The Membership Director will maintain a record (inventory list) of Club gear and coordinate sales of such with the Treasurer. It will be required that the Membership Director give a current membership report at monthly meetings.

**Secretary:** The Secretary shall handle all official correspondence of the club as necessary. Keep minutes of both the general membership and Board of Directors meetings. The Secretary shall provide a copy of the general membership meeting minutes to the Club newsletter editor for inclusion in the next month's newsletter.

**Treasurer:** The treasurer shall manage the financial affairs of the club, be custodian of the club funds and collect all dues payable by club members. The Treasurer will be responsible for overseeing the 50/50 raffle at club meetings or events as necessary. The Treasurer shall maintain an inventory list of all Club gear and coordinate sales of such with the Membership Director to keep track of all sales and inventory levels. The Treasurer shall render a financial report at monthly meetings and Board of Directors meetings.

**Tours & Events Director:** The Tours and Events Director is responsible for gathering information on upcoming rides and events making sure that information is accurate and as complete as possible. The Tours & Events Director shall send out a weekly email and update the RRMC hotline to inform members of the upcoming weekend's event(s). The Tours & Events Director shall give a summary of recent rides as well as report on upcoming activities at the monthly general meetings. The Tours and Events Director shall also coordinate rides with the Road Captains.

**Safety Director:** The Safety Director shall be in charge of determining safe group riding practices and to prepare and keep current the "RRMC Safe Group Riding" handout for RRMC members. The Safety Director's duties shall include observing the members during group rides and discussion with the members on safety issues including any violations of the RRMC (written) safe riding practices. The Safety Director is responsible for providing safety tips in the monthly newsletter and shall give a safety tip/report at the monthly general meeting.

**Sergeant at Arms:** The Sergeant at Arms shall provide assistance to the Board of Directors by calling to order all meeting and announcing the close of all meetings. The Sergeant at Arms will keep order during meetings to allow members speaking to be heard. The Sergeant at Arms is charged with keeping the peace among members.




