


our number one concern. Our board members as well as our road captains take our safety seriously. Let's all do our part to keep our club fun and safe.


NEW TREASURER


Group Riding Club Rules

PRE-RIDE

- Look at your bike. Take a look at your friend's bike. ARE THEY SAFE?
- Walk around your bike. Check your tires, brakes and look for any potential problem.
- Also check your lights, Are they all working?
- Is your tank full? Always come to rides with a full tank of fuel. Check your oil level, tire pressure and look for any leaks.
- It is recommended you wear a DOT or SNELL approved helmet.
- Carry your owners manual, registration, license, flashlight and basic tool kit. A tire repair kit is also recommended.

ON THE ROAD

- Always keep a safe distance between bikes. The suggested safety cushion discussed below is based upon normal riding conditions.
- Normal group riding formation is staggered. Allow a safety cushion of 1 second behind the nearest bike and 2-3 seconds behind the bike directly in front of you.
- When riding single file, keep a minimum of 2 seconds maneuvering space between bikes. Increase distance to 3-4 seconds on when visibility is limited due to curves or road conditions.
- Do not extend the distance more than 4 seconds since you may not see signals sent by the Road Captain.
- Maintain your position in the formation.
- Absolutely NO PASSING another rider during the ride.
 You may change your position in the formation when resuming the ride after rest / gas / lunch breaks.
- If you meet the group during the ride, position yourself at the end of the formation but before the sweep.
- Absolutely NO ALCOHOL! If you do consume alcoholic beverages during the lunch break, you must remove yourself from the group and ride behind the sweep. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- NO CONSUMPTION OF DRUGS which may cause an impairment.
- Stay focused. Pay close attention to other vehicles. Always be aware of everything going on around you.
- Don't be distracted.
- Do not ride in a car's blind spot.
- Hand signals are passed backwards from the Road Captain. Relay all signals back to the rider behind you.
- · Point to obstacles on the road.
- If you are having trouble keeping up with the group, inform the Road Captain at the earliest opportunity so he/she can adjust the pace.
- Inform the Road Captain or Sweep if you need to leave the group.
- No Co-Riders under the age of 16.
- No Pets on rides.
- Have Fun!

Group Riding Hand Signals

Since this seems to be the newsletter to address safety issues, here is a review of commonly used hand signals. Remember to PASS THEM BACK and make sure the rider behind you does the same.

Left turn Arm and hand extending left, palm facing down



Right turn Arm out, bent at 90° angle, fist clinched.



Stop Arm extended straight down, palm facing back.



Speed Up Arm extended straight out, palm facing up, swing upward.



Slow Down Arm extended straight out, palm facing down, swing down to your side.



Follow Me Arm extended straight up from shoulder, palm forward.



You Lead/Come Arm extended upward 45°, palm forward pointing with index finger, swing in arc from back to front.



Hazard in Roadway On the left, point with left hand; on the right, point with right foot.



Single File Arm and index finger extended straight up.



Double File Arm with index and middle finger extended straight up.



Comfort Stop Forearm extended, fist clenched with short up and down motion.



Refreshment Stop Fingers closed, thumb to mouth.



Turn Signal On Open and close hand with fingers and thumb extended.



Pull Off Arm positioned as for right turn, forearm swung toward shoulder.



Cops Ahead Tap on top of helmet with open palm down.



Fuel
Arm out to side pointing to tank with finger extended.

How Good of a Rider are YOU?

If you are like me, you will respond "Oh yea, I am good!" But, are you really. How much have you practiced your riding skills lately? I am sure you know athletes who are good. Do you think they practice their skills on a regular basis? You bet they do! If you are like me, you might practice, but only rarely. For example, I use "trail braking", but not with much confidence. My slow speed maneuvering sucks, and there are bound to be a dozen other things that I am either doing wrong, or that could be improved. Practice can make me a better, safer rider.

Our club has a unique opportunity. A professional motorcycle riding coach has agreed to come to our area to give semi-private lessons on public roads. His sessions have no more than 4 students, and last for about a half a day. Because the coach is a Redwood Riders sponsor, we will get a discount on the price of this service. I plan to take advantage of this opportunity. I feel confident with my riding skills, but I know I can improve them. If you decide not to sign up for this class, you should think about what you can practice safely on your own. If you want to take this class, let me or any board member know.


