

Safety Report

"Big" Ben Johnstone - Safety Officer

Safety While Group Riding

Do you feel safer when riding in a group? I do. A group of motorcycles is easier to see than a single rider. If something happens, there are others there to help. I can see the rider ahead of me hit a rough spot on the road and be able to either miss that spot or otherwise prepare myself. I can see the rider in front of me enter a curve and that gives me information about the sharpness of the curve. If I am connected via bluetooth, the rider ahead will warn of traffic/obstacles ahead.



When does riding in a group feel unsafe? If the rider ahead of me gets too far ahead, then I lose all of the benefits listed above. When the rider behind me falls back, I always slow until they catch up so that they can keep me in sight. If the rider behind me gets too close, or especially if they pass, my room to maneuver is significantly reduced. Someone passing me usually startles me to the point that I momentarily lose my concentration of the road. A too close or passing rider really makes me feel uncomfortable. When the rider in front of me doesn't hold their formation in the group, I always fall back to give them more room since I can't be sure what they might do next. This isn't really a unsafe condition, it just spreads the group out more.

The most important safe group riding rule is: Just like riding alone, don't ride beyond your skills! If you don't feel safe, slow down. Hopefully, the rider in front of you will notice the gap and also slow down. If we all do this, eventually the Road Captain will get the message and slow down as well.

CHANGE TO RIDE CALENDAR

Due to issues with crossing the Canadian Border, we are changing the destination and dates of our long ride this summer. See Page 7 for more information.

In addition, the Topaz Lake overnighter will be moved to August 13th.

Pacific Northwest Ride - July 9th to July 16th

I have finally set the route and time to our ride to the Pacific Northwest. We will leave on Saturday July 9th and return on Saturday July 16th. I apologize for changing the dates from what was originally scheduled. These dates are as fixed as possible.

I also changed the route and we will now stay in the USA. Because of Canada's restrictive Covid rules I thought it would be better to play it safe. These days you cannot count on the border being open at the time of the ride, so we stay in the states.

Here's the plan:

- Three days to go up Hwy 101 to Anacortes WA. Average miles per day 298.
- Next day we take a ferry to Friday Harbor and a tour on San Juan Island. Then back to our hotel in Anacortes for another night. Under 100 miles riding.
- Now we head Southeast on Hwy 90 to the Columbia River Basin. Hotel up in The Dalles at 318 miles.
- On the 14th we cross Oregon with a detour to Crater Lake. Our hotel is near Klamath Falls. That's 330 miles.
- The next day we tour Burney Falls and Lassen Volcanic Park with a hotel near Chester. That ride is 238 miles.
- The last day on the 16th we ride home via Hwy 20 and that's about 200 miles.

The total miles for this ride is about 2050 miles. I have tried to make the ride days as even as possible. I also have tried to stay off the freeway and find the most scenic roads to ride. As always, I am planning stops every hour or so. I like to take pictures, so figure on stopping at scenic sites.

Hotels are much more difficult to find than pre-pandemic times. I would say the average night's hotel cost is \$150. I have reserved mostly double queen rooms, so it best to double up with a partner. Prices are higher and services are cut, it just a fact of life.

I will have an official sign up and booking instructions out very shortly. If you are planning on doing this ride sign up early and book your rooms or they won't be there. Look for the email with all the booking and sign up information. I will email it to all members soon. This is a members only ride.

Tom's Take

Not to Channel Emily Post but Here Goes...

Most of us Redwood Riders have been riding for many, many years, though some are semi-newbies. We often participate in wonderful, scenic, sociable group rides that place a top value on safe and sane biking. The "red ass" biker brigade would likely not feel the love for our preferred style. To that end, let's take a moment to review a few of the riding habits that make our group rides safe, sane and fun.

Show up on time. Since our rides are carefully scheduled to allow time for the planned route—and out of respect for your fellow riders—show up on time, or even early to allow time for schmoozing. Fifteen or 20 riders would take a dim view of being asked to wait for a late arrival.



Be sure your gas tank is full when you arrive. Again, no one wants to hang around at Shari's (pie or no pie) while someone goes for gas.

These obvious bits of protocol are simply to show respect for the leader and the planning they did, as well as to the pack, who should not be expected to put with unnecessary waiting around.

Inform the ride leader. Of course, there are sometimes good reasons for delays, like medical issues. If you have a medical issue that might show its effect during a ride, inform the leader of that before the ride begins. And bring along any medications you might require, even if the odds of needing them are low. Better safe than sorry, right? And if you have specialized food needs, it may be wise to bring along what you need to eat. Many of our dining venues are not equipped to accommodate special diets.

Know the destination and the route If the route is unfamiliar to you, ask the leader for a map. That way, if you somehow get separated from the group, you may be able to locate them at a gas, rest or food stop—or at the motel/hotel in the case of overnight rides.

Abide by the leader's information as to duration of the breaks. If you need extra time, let it be known to the leader, who will deal with it accordingly. If, for whatever reason, you think you may become separated from the group, attempt to locate a "travel pal" who would agree to stick together with your as a pair, in the event of a separation form the group.

This list is by no means exhaustive. There are other riding habits that also affect our rides.
