Meeting called to order at 7^{PM} by Sqt. at Arms, Paul Benkover

Dual lenses on the helmet helped keep the fog from forming and having a pin lock. Use Rain-X on both the inside and the outside of the visor. Be aware of the possibility of rocks dropping on the road when riding along hillsides. Rosalie mentioned the use of emergency flashers which makes it easier to follow a rider and makes them more visible to other traffic

New Business: Dave "Taz" Tinkler mentioned that the Harley dealer was having a Demo Day this coming weekend. All new Harley models will be available for people to take out on a test ride.

Safety Report

Too Fast in a Corner? Now What?

On a recent trip, I was coming back from Chester on highway 36. Just west of Red Bluff, I saw one of those diamond shaped signs with a wriggly road on it. Below the sign was a placard which stated, "next 130 miles". This got me wondering what I would do if I found myself going too fast after I already entered a corner. There are things I can do to lower the risk of this happening. I move to the outside so that I can see farther through the curve. I find the "vanishing point" of the road to help me judge the severity of the turn (by looking as far ahead as I can). I utilize trail breaking, so I am already breaking (smoothly) when I enter the curve. This allows me to increase or decrease my braking once I get a good look



at the curve. Of course, I note the suggested speed posted for the curve, if there is one.

Even doing this, it is possible to get surprised in a curve. So what should I do? First I should realize that the tires and the bike can turn faster than I normally do. If I am not scraping parts on the road, the tires will hold (dry conditions). I should keep turning hard and lean off the low side to keep the bike as upright as possible. I should brake hard early and ease the braking as I turn sharper. I look where I want to go; not at any obstacles I want to avoid (this is very important). I avoid any sudden or jerky movements, keeping everything as smooth as I can.

If I really think I can't safely get around the curve, I straighten up and brake hard (I have ABS). This does the job but has the risk of taking me into the next lane, or off the road. I prefer not to do this if possible.


Feel free to share any other information your fellow riders might find interesting about you.
